Thursday, December 28:

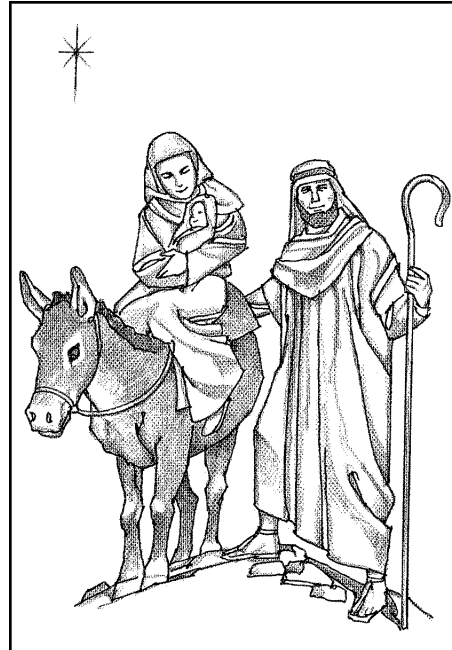
Pray for Philip Kim and the students at Urbana 2006 in St. Louis; that their hearts and minds may be filled with the Holy Spirit.

Pray today for couples who are having marital problems; that 2007 will be a year of forgiveness and reconciliation.

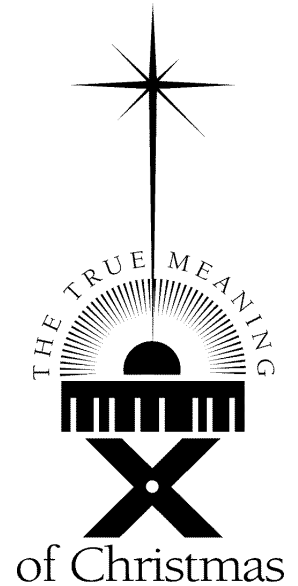
