Thursday, October 27

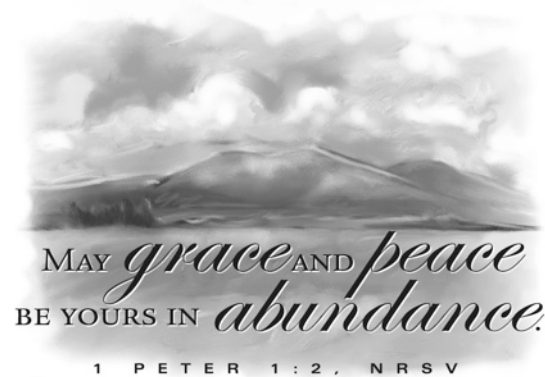
Pray for autistic children. Give thanks for the parents, caregivers and teachers who care for them with patience, love and hope.
